Biographical/Historical Note

George Washington Behn was one of the organizing members of the Savannah Area Chamber of Commerce in 1841. He was also a member of the Board of Health and served as a Captain in the Georgia Hussars from 1840-1843. In 1842 he wrote a Concise System of Instruction, Arranged and Adopted for the Volunteer Cavalry of the United States.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of one petty daybook that includes information on dry-goods from November 1842 through April 1843. It is indexed by surname.
