Biographical/Historical Note

Caleb Davis Bradlee (1831-1897) was a doctor of divinity and the minister of several Unitarian churches in Boston.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of thirteen letters to C.D. Bradlee. Judging by his notes on the back of them, he valued them for their autographs. Some of the letters are filled in printed forms; some are autograph letters, signed. They are mainly acknowledgments of Bradlee's sermons and poems sent as gifts.

Correspondents in chronological order are: Joshua L. Chamberlain, president of Bowdoin College, 1876; A.S. Packard, librarian at Bowdoin College, 1876; Governor Alexander H. Rice of Massachusetts, 1878; Emile Rivoire of the Public Library of Geneva, Switzerland, 1878; E.G. Robinson, president of Boston University, 1878; Reuben Guild, librarian at Brown University, 1878; E.A. Dalrymple of the Maryland Historical Society, 1878; Edward A. Bond, principal librarian of the British Museum, 1879; Luigi Bisi, president of R. Accademia Di Belle Arti, Milan, 1879; W.N. du Rien, University of Leyden, 1884; James Grant Wilson, New Jersey, 1884; Edward Everett Hale, Massachusetts, 1886; Brooke Herford, Massachusetts, 1886; Mellen Chamberlain, librarian at Boston Public Library, 1886.
