Biographical/Historical Note

Lenoir Chambers (1891-1970) was a newspaper editor and author. He is best known for his work on Stonewall Jackson and winning the Pulitzer Prize for his editorials in 1959. He was the Gilmer Lecturer in 1961. This lecture was established through the will of Louisa Porter Gilmer Minis.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a lecture, "Lee and Jackson: Command Performance," given by Lenoir Chambers on April 11, 1961. The lecture was part of the Gilmer Lecture Series in Savannah, Georgia. The lecture discusses the relationship between Lee and Jackson and their interaction during the Civil War.
