Biographical/Historical Note

Jeremiah Kendall and John Garreth were merchants in Augusta, Georgia.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of letters written by Jeremiah Kendall and John Garreth to Seth John Cuthbert. Cuthbert (d. 1788) was a native of South Carolina and a merchant in Savannah. He was a member of the Georgia Provincial Congress and of the Executive Council, a major in the Georgia Militia, and Treasurer of Georgia. The letter discuss shipping between Savannah and Augusta, as well as the current prices of corn, butter, tobacco, flour, salt pork, sugar, and coffee.
