Biographical/Historical Note

Feeley's Livery Stable began operation prior to 1859 in Savannah, Georgia. Its owner, John Feeley, and his descendants operated the business well into the 20th century. By the late 1880s it was known as J. Feeley and Sons, and by 1900 the livery was known as the Feeley Transfer Company.

This collection contains the daybook that shows accounts for Feeley's Livery Stable from June 18, 1870 to June 17, 1872.
