## Biographical/Historical Note

The Kin Mori Gold Mining Company was established around the year 1875 by Charles W. Short of Cincinnati on 680 acres he purchased in Dawson County, Georgia. Mr. Short's company failed during the Panic of 1893, so he closed down the mine and assigned the property to another person. In 1918 he bought the property back from his assignee but did not resume operation of the mine. Short died in 1926 and the property was inherited by his sons, Charles W. Short, Jr., and John Cleves Short.

## Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of 70 deeds to the Kin Mori Gold Mining Company property, 1832-1883; engineers' reports, 1892 and 1893; a typed copy of a letter to C.W. Short and J.C. Short, January 14, 1927, containing assays made in 1881; a sketch of the history of the Kin Mori Gold Mining property with extracts of engineers' reports attached, undated; and a map of the property made by Hall Brothers Engineers, Atlanta, undated.
