Biographical/Historical Note

Samuel Mercer arrived in Georgia on August 29, 1733. He was a tanner by trade. He cultivated some land near Savannah. In 1738, he was appointed Second Constable.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a grant for a town lot and garden lot in Savannah, granted to Elizabeth Mercer by King George II as a memorial to Samuel Mercer. It is dated September 8, 1756 and is a printed, completed form. Elizabeth Mercer was the widow of John Tisdale; she was his third wife.
