Biographical/Historical Note

Alton Pemberton was born between 1770 and 1780. He arrived in Savannah Georgia, from England in 1803. He was a member of the Georgia Militia in 1807. While in Savannah, he married a woman with the maiden name Reynolds. He is listed in Federal Census of 1830 as between the ages of 50 and 60.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a deed of conveyance between Alton Pemberton of Waynesboro, Georgia, and Thomas Nock Pemberton Sr. and Thomas Nock Pemberton, Jr. of London, for two individual ninth shares of property in Tipton Staffordshire. The deed also includes one-sixth of the mines and minerals on that land and is dated 1832. The deed was certified by Edmund Molyneux, British Consul at Savannah. It is on parchment.
