Charles Henry Smith (1826-1903), journalist and humorist known as "Bill Arp," was born in Lawrenceville, Georgia. He attended the University of Georgia and later became a lawyer. He served all through the Civil War. About 1887, he moved to Cartersville, Georgia, where he lived until his death.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a letter from Charles Henry Smith to James Callaway, 1902. In the letter, Smith solicits financial help, as he must supplement his income.
