Biographical/Historical Note

Paschal Neilson Strong (1820-1887), born in New York City, worked in the cotton business in New Orleans. He was one of the founders of Tulane University and was its treasurer until his death. His widow, Louisa Hall Strong moved to Savannah in circa 1893, where their son, Rev. Charles Hall Strong, was the rector of St. John's Episcopal Church.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a membership card belonging to P.N. Strong in the Beaugard Rifles, 1864; a bill for goods delivered to Louisa Hall Strong and brought in through the blockade, Nassau, 1864; a permit for P.N. Strong to remain in Augusta, Georgia, for 60 days, from the Headquarters Post in Augusta, 1865; a receipt from Charles Hall to P.N. Strong for one year's rent of a dwelling in Augusta, 1865; and a receipt of Kate Beaugard Gugal for French lessons given to Cora Strong, dated during the 1860s (the last digit is missing). The bill for goods bears a note stating that the goods came on the last blockade runner into Wilmington, North Carolina.
