Biographical/Historical Note

Sarah Amanda King Walker, daughter of Reuben King, born July 26, 1817 and died May 13, 1876, was married May 23, 1839 in Darien Georgia, to her cousin, James Walker of Homer, NY, son of the Rev. Elnathan Walker and Aurelia (King) Walker. Both Sarah and James were buried at Upper Mill Cemetery, Darien, GA. More information can be found about the King family in *Collections of the Georgia Historical Society*, Vol XV edited by Virginia Steele Wood and Ralph Van Wood, available in the Georgia Historical Society main collection.

Scope and Content Note

This is a collection of letters and a report all related to the family of Sarah Amanda King Walker. In documents in this collection, Sarah Amanda King Walker is referred to as Amanda. There are two letters from James to Amanda discussing his search for employment and other family news. There is one letter from Donald M. McIntosh to Amanda apologizing for the delay in returning a book. And there is a report by Reuben King Walker for the week ending July 12, 1850. The report does not indicate what is being tracked.

Tells of experiences and prospects for employment; is trying to obtain cotton factorage; mentions several persons.
