Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a letter written by Henry Wray, but signed by Henry and his sister Drucilla, to Mildred, a sibling. Henry and Drucilla live in Cedar Town, Georgia and emphasize the need for news on the impending war between the states. They ask for confirmation that Fort Sumter has been fired upon and to confirm that the Confederate soldiers are still in control of the fort. Additionally, the letter includes family news and discussion of family/friends joining the volunteers to fight in the war.
