Biographical/Historical Note

John Irvine Stoddard (ca. 1843-1924) was a general insurance agent in Savannah, Georgia. He was active in several social and religious organizations. He spent the last twenty-five years of his life. A "John Stoddard" is referred to as an honorary member of the Confederate States of America Organization of Savannah Artillery and Roster, February 1861.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of an honorary diploma from the University of Georgia, 1913. Honorary diplomas were issued to those people still living who had left the university to enter the Confederate States Army or who were denied diplomas because of the closing of the school during the Civil War.
