## Biographical/Historical Note

The Reverend Charles Barrington King (1823-1880) was the son of Barrington King (1798-1866) and Catherine Margaret Nephew King (1804-1887). He graduated from the University of Georgia in 1845 and finished his theology training at Princeton in 1848. While living in Savannah, Georgia, King preached at First Presbyterian Church and White Bluff Presbyterian Church. He was also a visiting pastor at Bethesda Home for Boys. He was survived by his wife Anna Wylly Habersham King, three daughters, and five sons.

## Scope and Content Note

This collection contains an account book from the household of the Reverend Charles Barrington King (1823-1880). The book, which begins in January 1865, contains a note on the first page pointing out the entry of General Sherman into Savannah, Georgia and King's ensuing loss of his slaves. This book contains the records of costs of hired servants after the loss of his slaves. Also included in this collection are some account sheets indicating the repayment of loans or for financial transactions like the purchase of cotton.
