## Biographical/Historical Note

Birth and death dates for Felix Kohler are not available, but information provided by the donor indicates that he was a contemporary of actor Charles Coburn (1877-1961), with whom he performed in Savannah theaters in Georgia. The Savannah, Georgia city directories between 1890 and 1910 list Kohler as a travel agent and as a general manager of the Colonial Amusement Company. It is known that he married Bertha Glaser of Macon, Georgia. Kohler left Savannah sometime after 1910, living for a time in New Orleans, Louisiana, and Mason City, Iowa.

## Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a short story by Felix Kohler entitled "In a Satchel" (circa 1936) that is presented as non-fiction. It was written by Kohler for publication in a serial and outlines an unusual chain of events that leads to romance between Larry Callaway of Claxton, Georgia and Amelia Leader of Vidalia, Georgia sometime after the Spanish-American War (1898). Evidence concerning the existence of Callaway and Leader could not be found.
