This speech is attributed to A. S. Wallace, county school superintendent of Taylor County, Georgia, on whose letterhead it was written. This speech was given in Daviston, Georgia in July before a gathering of "Ladies, Gentlemen, Sons and Daughters of the Confederacy and Comrades." The speech recounts Georgia's experience in the Civil War, during Reconstruction, and during the post-Reconstruction years.
