Biographical/Historical Note

Lumpkin County, Georgia was established by the state legislature in 1832. Named for Wilson Lumpkin, the county was the site of the 1828 gold rush, the first of its magnitude in the country. Dahlonega is the county seat.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of a microfilm copy of land records pertaining to the property now occupied by the courthouse in Lumpkin County, Georgia. The courthouse is now a State Historical monument. Included are the original gold lottery land grant to Peleg R. McCrary, a plat of the granted land, a certified copy of the grant and a certified copy of the plat, and the original copy of the deed showing Peleg R. McCrary deeding the land to the Inferior Court of Lumpkin County. These documents are the first set of materials on microfilm roll X-1545-04; this roll contains materials from multiple collections.

These documents were microfilmed by the Georgia Department of Archives and History in 1966.
