Scope and Content Note

This collection contains photographs and school yearbooks collected by Mahla Kent Wilson from 1885 to 1989. The following school yearbooks are included in this collection: Savannah High School in Savannah, Georgia's The Blue Jacket (1920-1921); Shorter College in Rome, Georgia's The Argo (1925, 1950); Pape School in Savannah's The Paper (1948); Independent Presbyterian Church School in Savannah's Forward (1952-1953); Independent Presbyterian Church kindergarten, preschool, and elementary school in Savannah's The Rileyville Record (1956-1957); and the Shorter College in Rome's Alumni Directory (1989). Also included are photographs, daguerreotypes, and tintypes of members of the Wilson, Fry, Kent, and Whiteside families of Georgia, Florida, and Alabama. Majority of the photographs have identification information on the reverse side.
