Biographical/Historical Note

Remer Young Lane (1910-1984), a Savannah, Georgia, native and retired businessman and farmer, was deeply interested in the history of Savannah and coastal Georgia. He worked on numerous projects to document this history, including inventorying and researching trees, researching the history of fires and hurricanes in Savannah, and numerous other projects to document the history of the region.

Scope and Content Note

This collection consists of six cassette tapes containing interviews (and transcripts) between Remer Y. Lane and three local fishermen: James Adams, Louis Mathews, and Gilbert Maggioni. The interviews focus on the history of the fishing industry in the coastal area of Georgia.
