Biographical/Historical Note

First founded as the Union Academy in 1809, Eatonton Academy was a classical school in Eatonton, Putnam County, Georgia. It is no longer in operation. Alonzo Church, the first principal, became a professor and president of University of Georgia.

Scope and Content Note

This collection contains two items from 1890. One lists the special rules of conduct of the principal's room. The other is general rules regarding separation of boys and girls cloakrooms and playgrounds, as well as a rule for damage charges.
