The Lebanon Plantation is located in Savannah, Georgia. In 1916, it was bought by Mills B. Lane I and his wife, Mary Comer Lane, to provide a summer experience for their children and a location for agricultural experimentation and horticulture.

This collection contains a framed, painted photograph of the land of the Lebanon Plantation in Savannah, Georgia from the 1930s. Mills B. Lane I, owner of the plantation, is on the right of the photograph and Herschel V. Jenkins, editor of the Savannah Morning News, is on the left.
