Biographical/Historical Note

The Chatham Crusade for Progress was made up of a group of politically conscious citizens in Chatham County, Georgia who wanted to ensure a better government for the county by replacing the incumbent county commissioners with their own candidates: William F. Lynes, Chuck Wood, Bob Lovett, Lee Mingledorff, Cary Anderson, Hal Murray, and Marvin Lesser in the 1960 election.
